Subject: Underground Transmission Line

Dear Mr. Ryan,

We refer to your letter and attached plans dated April 29, 2020, requesting permission to construct a buried transmission line crossing the boundary in Lake Champlain between New York and Quebec just east of Mon 645A.

Under the authority of the International Boundary Commission, United States and Canada, we hereby permit the construction operations as described in your request, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The work shall be carried out in compliance with your letter of application.
- 2. No international boundary monuments shall be damaged, disturbed, or endangered by the work;
- 3. No other objects or structures shall be placed within three meters (10 feet) of the international boundary line.
- 4. No debris shall be left on the six meter (twenty foot) boundary vista.
- 5. All necessary approvals relating to the proposed work shall be obtained from the appropriate federal and provincial authorities.
- 6. The International Boundary Commission and its members do not in any way assume any responsibility or liability with respect to any damage or loss incurred or sustained as a result of this letter of authorization.
