The meeting was called to order at 10:37 a.m. and a quorum was confirmed.

- 1. Motion to approve 9/12/22 Meeting minutes made by NYC, Seconded by Scenic Hudson, motion carried unanimously.
- 2. The project's groundbreaking has occurred and was attended by the governor. Project construction begins with the Whitehall laydown yard.
- 3. Interconnection Study

- a. TDI has accepted cost allocations
- b. Astoria Rainey interconnection agreement should be completed in 2023
- 4. EM & CP
 - a. Are being submitted on a segment by segment basis and are working with DPS staff
 - b. 4 have been filed and 1 has been approved by the Commission
 - c. HDD's are projected to begin during the summer of 2023
 - d. Lake Champlain EM & CP segments are expected in Feb 2023
 - e. Hudson River EM & CP segments expected in Mid 2023
 - f. Harlem River EM & CP segments are expected in late 2023
 - g. Additional upland segments of the EM & CP are expected in late 1st quarter early 2nd quarter 2023
- 5. Commercial operations is targeted for May 2026
- 6. Ongoing studies
 - a. Iding co-located infrastructure
 - b. Divers have been operating in the Hudson River regularly until early December
 - i. Field work has been completed for baseline studies
 - ii. Future follow ups will be forthcoming
 - c. TSS studies are being conducted as part of the EM & CP process
- 7. Trust
 - a. The trust has been funded with 2.5 million dollars
 - b. PSC has approved all documents related to the trust
 - c. Certificate Holder provided a bound document containing relevant trust materials
 - d. DOS requested PDFs of the bound document to be provided to committee members
 - e. TU requested and was provided clarification on the trust funding acceleration dollar values
- 8. HRF discussed TWG actions and the need for additional work
 - a. advised on the need to start thinking about the 75/25 funding ratios
 - b. advised for members to start thinking about the roles of the agencies in communications
 - c. has a goal of having a draft 5 year implementation plan by March '23
 - d. Riverkeeper asked about TWGs
 - e. APA indicated that they will have new staff to add to the Lake Champlain TWG
- 9. OML
 - a. This meeting was originally noticed as containing a public hearing to accept comments on a resolution allowing for remote attendance in conformance with the Open Meeting Law. No commentors presented themselves and no comments were received

- b. A motion was made by DOS and Seconded by NYC to accept a resolution allowing from remote attendance as outlined.
