

NOTICE OF HUDSON RIVER CABLE INSTALLATION WORK FOR CHAMPLAIN HUDSON POWER EXPRESS

Please take notice that, on or about August 1, 2025, CHPE, LLC and CHPE Properties, Inc. (collectively referred to as “CHPE” or “Certificate Holders”) intend to resume work on Segment 19B, Hudson River Cable Installation, of the Champlain Hudson Power Express (“CHPE”) Project, pursuant to the Environmental Management & Construction Plan (“EM&CP”) approved by the New York State Public Service Commission (“Commission”) on June 20, 2024. Work in the Hudson River began in 2024 in the Cementon-Stony Point Hudson Marine Segment. CHPE’s 2025 work will include additional remedial work in the Cementon-Stony Point Hudson Marine Segment, as well as all three phases of work in the Congers-Harlem Hudson Marine Segment, starting with the pre-lay grapnel run and debris removal phase, cable installation, and the remedial phase, which will include post-lay mattress installation and other activities. Work is anticipated to occur August through November 2025.

Installation work will occur on a 24-hour, 7-day-per-week basis to facilitate timely and efficient installation of the CHPE Project. Steps will be taken to minimize construction impacts during work conducted at night, through the use of noise and lighting mitigation measures, to minimize the temporary construction impacts on nearby sensitive receptors to the maximum extent practicable given other seasonal time restrictions applicable to work in the Hudson River.

The Commission issued CHPE a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need (“Certificate”) pursuant to Article VII of the Public Service Law on April 18, 2013 authorizing CHPE to construct and operate the CHPE Project. The Certificate requires that, prior to construction of any portion of the Project, CHPE disseminate construction notices to the public and obtain a Notice to Proceed with Construction from the New York State Department of Public Service staff.

The EM&CP provides detailed information regarding how this Segment of the Project will be constructed, the specific locations of the proposed route, as well as descriptions of work to be performed, plan and profile drawings depicting the Project, plans and protocols to be used during construction to protect the community and the environment, and to comply with the CHPE Certificate.
